Once again, the Editors wish to thank those readers who have so generously contributed to the *Teiresias* "fund", as well as those who have brought to our attention items which we would otherwise have missed. Readers are particularly requested to inform us of new books which deal wholly or in part with Boiotian matters: we can cover serial publications more or less completely and within a respectable span of time, but on the whole books take longer to come to our notice.

Deadline: The Deadline for the receipt of material (preferably offprints, if possible, but in any case detailed references) for Volume 3, Part 1 (to be dated June 1973) will be March 31, 1973. We hope to include data and material published during the last six months of 1972. However, if readers can find anything we have missed from 1970, 1971 and the first half of 1972, we shall be happy to include it. We also welcome reports of work in progress, as well as suggestions for the general improvement of *Teiresias*.

Policy on Communications: Although much of the space in *Teiresias* is taken up with bibliographical matter and reports of work in progress, our columns are open to students of Boiotian antiquities who may feel that they have something of interest to communicate to our readers. However, it should be noted that these communications are in fact letters to the editors, and that we are not responsible for the views expressed therein. It will also be clear that we do not provide offprints of such communications.

Subscription: Single copies of *Teiresias* are available to individuals and non-profit institutions directly without charge; *Teiresias* is therefore not distributed to the book trade.

A copy of the machine-readable text has been deposited with the American Philological Association's data bank; duplicates of this and other material in the bank can be obtained from the editor".
