McArthur (Monash University) has completed a fourth year Honours dissertation entitled "Implications of recent archaeological discoveries in Crete and in Thebes for the problem of the dating and origin of the Theban stirrup-jars" (62 pp.); the abstract is as follows: "This dissertation investigates some of the problems associated with the dating and origin of the inscribed stirrup-jars found by A. D. Keramopoullos in the 'Old Kadmeion' at Thebes in 1921. Certain recent archaeological discoveries made in Thebes and at Chania and Knossos in Crete are examined in detail for any support they might give to the arguments for and against a Cretan origin and late date (LM IIIB) for the stirrup-jars. The implications to be drawn from these discoveries suggest the need for some revision of the traditional view of Late Minoan Crete, particularly in the Late Minoan IIIB period. They favour the proposition that the jars are Cretan and late. The epigraphical evidence for the jars' likely Cretan origin would appear to some scholars to have been confirmed by a scientific test. In this dissertation an attempt is made to critically examine the methods used in the spectrographic analysis of the clay composition of twenty-five of the Theban stirrup-jars carried out at the Research Laboratory at Oxford in 1965. The conclusion reached suggests the need for greater refinement of techniques and the adoption of more stringent statistical procedures in research of this kind". -- Communicated by E.
